POTENTIAL HAZARDS and HOW TO DEAL WITH THEM:

Whether assembling for or leaving from a trip, proximity to vehicles may introduce a hazard. Likewise, uneven surfaces such as curbs, roads and sidewalks can be treacherous if care is not taken.

Attention must be paid both boarding and disembarking from cars, trucks, buses, boat or any other vehicle.

- Any trip involving vehicular transportation such as a car, truck, bus or boat involves the risk of an accident. As well, inappropriate behavior and conduct while in a car, truck, bus or boat, whether it is moving or stationary, can cause an accident.
- Uneven surfaces can be a hazard when walking - wear proper footwear, walk slowly and watch your footing.
- Weather conditions might vary- make sure you have the appropriate clothing for the season.
- Covid-19 is still a public health hazard- maintain physical distance of 2 metres (6 feet) between participants, wear masks when required, use hand sanitizers, or/and wash your hands whenever possible.
- Proximity to old buildings and equipment can cause scrapes - keep a safe distance and do not touch.
- Insect bites can occur in the outdoors - dress appropriately and use repellent. A safe attitude is to be primary in all activities.

In consideration of the Canadian Society of Petroleum Geologists ("CSPG") allowing me to participate in **Folds, Fractures, and Reservoir Compartmentalization in structurally complex reservoirs: Canyon Creek Southern Canadian Rocky Mountains**, I waive any and all claims that I have or may in the future have against, and release from all liability and agree not to sue, the Canadian Society of Petroleum Geologists ("CSPG"), any of their directors, officers, employees, servants, agents, representatives, volunteers, field seminar and/or seminar leaders (collectively the "Personnel"), as well as other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers, and, if applicable, owners and leasers of premises used for the Field Seminar **for any personal injury, death, property damage or other loss that I sustain during or as a result of any Field Trip** due to any cause whatsoever on the part of anyone or more of CSPG, the Personnel or others, including:

- a. **Negligence** (the meaning of which includes failure to use such care as a reasonable, prudent and careful person would use under similar circumstances and failure to meet standards of care in field seminar in the Province of Alberta for the safety of participants);
- b. **Breach of any other duty imposed by law**, including any duty imposed by occupier's liability or other legislation;
- c. **Breach of any contract**; and
- d. **Mistakes or errors in judgment** of any kind.

I am aware of the risks inherent in the Field Seminar, including:

- a. **Rural Terrain:** I am aware that the Field Seminar includes visiting terrain which has many dangers, obstacles and hazards including:
 - Exposure to cold, wet weather or the effects of heat and strong sunlight, or strong winds;
 - Curious or aggressive wildlife: carnivores, omnivores, rodents, insects, birds, snakes, or other domestic or non-domestic animals;
 - Bacterial, parasitic or fungal hazards, such as Giardia;
 - Falls on, from, or onto steep, slippery or uneven terrain resulting in contact with rocks, trees, obstructions or other participants;
 - Falling rock, flooding, immersion in cold water potentially causing hypothermia, shock or drowning;
 - Deadfall and noxious vegetation.
 - Long emergency response time for medical help.
- b. **Motor Vehicle:** I am aware of the risk of mechanical failure or operational error including driver error.
- c. **Boat:** I am aware of the risk of mechanical failure or operational error including driver error.
- d. **Oil and Gas Exploration and Production Operations!** I am aware that such operations are included in Field Trip and includes a risk of:
 - Exposure to high voltages, moving cables and machinery, geophysical energy sources (including explosives), heat sources, and electromagnetic fields.
 - Exposure to gas fumes including hydrogen sulphide, natural gas and crude oil vapors.

I assume and accept all the risks and dangers of the Field Seminar and the possibility of personal injury, death, property damage or other loss as a result. I willingly accept these risks and agree to the terms of this Field Seminar Waiver, even if CSPG or any of the Personnel are found in law to be negligent or in breach of a duty of care or any other obligation to me in their conduct of any Field Seminar.

In signing this Field Seminar Waiver, I am not relying on any oral, written or visual statements of any kind, including promotional statements made by CSPG in its brochures or by any of the Personnel to induce me to go on a Field Seminar.
